board the bus immediately after the production to head back to Academy High. Our estimated time of arrival is 5:15pm. We are so excited for the chance to see this production in person!


Save the Date! Prom Scheduled for April 27th


Physics for Juniors and Seniors

This semester our junior and senior students are taking physics with Dr. Josek. Dr. Josek has an illustrious background in science and education. They completed their bachelors, masters, and doctorate at the University of Illinois, where they currently serve as a microscopist at the Beckman Institute for Advanced Science and Technology.

Dr. Josek previously served as a Postdoctoral Associate and Instructor at Illinois State University. As a graduate student and postdoctoral associate, Dr. Josek developed science curricula for high school and college students. One of these units (the Lyme



disease unit that many of our students have completed) was co-designed with Mrs. Capell.



Students in physics are currently engaged in an OpenSciEd curriculum unit exploring the Texas energy crisis of 2021. This unit, developed by education professionals at University of Colorado Boulder has earned the NGSS Design Badge. In this unit, students will be exploring how energy transfers between different systems and developing engineering solutions to develop reliable energy systems.

New Class for 9th Graders: Introduction to Experimental Design

Intro to Experimental Design is a new freshman class being offered at Academy High. In this class, students will dive into the process of science, honing their skills at observation, developing testable hypotheses, creating well-designed experiments, collecting & analyzing data, and communicating scientific information (through writing lab reports and presenting formal research posters).

Students are currently designing their first experiment that will test the effectiveness of different soaps and hand sanitizers at removing bacteria from their hands. Later this semester, students will design



experiments that test the different effects that various environmental conditions have on the regeneration rate of planarians (a freshwater flatworm).

Senior Night: Pack the House

Our last home basketball game will take place on Thursday, February

8th at 6:00pm at the Savoy Recreation Center. This game will be senior night for our two seniors: Sophia Libman and Eleanor Laufenberg.

Alongside senior night, we will also hold a "pack the house" night to get as many Academy High students, parents, and fans to attend! All Academy High students who attend the game will get free admission and will receive a free drink and snack when they arrive. Owler Café concessions will also be selling food and drinks. This is a great opportunity for students looking for service hours or resume boosters as well as those interested pursuing a career outdoors:



Girls Who Code's Free Virtual Summer Programs Overview

Our free virtual summer programs are open to 9-12th graders who identify as girls or non-binary. Any coding experience level is welcome!

In addition to our free programs, we offer a financial support grant of up to \$300 and laptop and hotspot access for eligible students.

This year, students can choose to learn new coding skills in game design, web design, cybersecurity, or data science and artificial intelligence! As they build computer science skills, students will learn about the many diverse careers in tech through virtual events with professionals in the field.
