

Tell us a little about what you've been up to since you graduated? I began my Freshman year of college at New York University's Manhattan campus, where I am majoring in Environmental Studies. Two of my favorite classes so far are Environmental Systems Science and Environment & Society. Throughout my time at NYU, I have made many close friends from different backgrounds that study different things. Some friends come from New Jersey and major in Biology, while others are from Singapore and major in fashion and sustainability. Together we like spending time at Washington

Square Park, shopping in K-Town under the Empire State Building, eating in Chinatown and St. Marks, going to concerts and museums, and exploring the city.

Is there anything specific about your college experience that you feel Academy High prepared you particularly well for? One thing Academy made easy for me was reaching out to my professors. While my relationship with my teachers at Academy isn't exactly the same as the one I have with my professors, it helped me talk to them and get to know them (and get them to know me). This not only helped me pass my classes when I was handling the workload but also will be helpful in the future. Another thing Academy prepared me for was being able to manage my work every week. I found that my Academy eased us into the way colleges give us work really well.

When you look back on your time at Academy High, what do you remember most about your experience? One of the most important experiences at Academy was at the end of my Senior year. I had some mental health issues that prevented me from attending school for a while, but all my teachers were highly understanding and supportive. I received plenty of help and accommodations for my missing work and was able to graduate with my peers. Another great experience with Academy was taking a group trip to China with the Chinese class in my Freshman year. This was one of the most rewarding trips I have ever had. We did a lot of touring the country while spending time with students from China and learning about the culture.

What advice would you give a freshman student as they begin their Academy High journey? My advice would be to take advantage of the smaller size and all that Academy offers. Your teachers are there to help you grow and building strong connections with them will open many opportunities and motivate you to learn a lot in school. Being close to your classmates is just as important. They will be there to push you to be better and have fun. A great way to make friends is to join clubs you are interested in, where you'll be able to meet people with similar interests and do things you enjoy. If there is a club you want to join but doesn't exist, Academy also makes it easy for you to start your own club.
